## Biographical Sketch

Gerald E. "Jerry" Talbot was born in 1932 in Bangor, ME, which at the time was home to Maine's largest African American community, many people having come to the state from Canada. His family traced their history in Maine back to the mid-18<sup>th</sup> century and the black Revolutionary War veteran Abraham Talbett. Talbot worked for some time with his father, W. Edgerton "Edgar" Talbot, the head chef at the Bangor House hotel, and graduated from Bangor High School in 1952. After serving in the army from 1953 to 1956, he moved to Portland and wed Anita Cummings of Portland, with whom he raised four daughters. The family faced job and housing discrimination, but Talbot eventually secured steady work in 1966 as a compositor with the Guy Gannett Publishing Company, where he would work for 25 years.

In Portland, Talbot also became actively involved with the civil rights movement in Maine, particularly through the NAACP. He served as president of the Portland branch of this organization three times, in 1964-66, 1970-71, and 1978-80, and was a vice president of the New England Regional NAACP. He joined the "March for Jobs and Freedom" in Washington, D.C. in 1963, participated in a voter registration drive in Mississippi in 1965, and played an important role in passing Maine's 1966 "Fair Housing Bill." He was the first African American elected to the Maine State Legislature, serving three terms from 1972 to 1978. During his time there, he proposed a 1977 bill titled, "An Act to Prohibit the Use of Offensive Names for Geographic Features and Other Places in the State of Maine," which passed. He also co-sponsored, with the late Larry Connolly, the first "Sexual or Affectional Preference" (1977) amendment to the Maine Human Rights Act. He was the first black chair of a legislative committee – the Human Resources Committee (two terms) – and was the first black speaker pro-tem of the Maine House of Representatives.

Talbot also served on the Maine State Board of Education from 1980-84, as chair in 1984. Simultaneously, he was on the New England States Board of Education Commission. He has been on the Maine Vocational Technical Institute's Board of Trustees and the Muskie Board of Visitors at the University of Southern Maine. In 1980, he founded Black Education and Cultural History, Inc. (BEACH), which sponsors conferences, offers scholarships, and serves as a vehicle for speaking out against discrimination. Talbot is co-author with H.H. Price of several articles and the book, *Maine's Visible Black History: The First Chronicle of Its People*, published in 2006.

Throughout his life, Talbot collected documents, books, photographs, and objects with significance to the African American community, both in Maine and beyond. These materials documenting black history, heritage, and culture, were exhibited often throughout Maine, including at the State House. In 1995, in order to ensure that the materials would be forever accessible to the public for educational purposes, Talbot donated his collection to the Special Collections of the University of Southern Maine, where it serves as the backbone of the African American Collection of the Jean Byers

Sampson Center for Diversity in Maine.

Gerald and Anita Talbot have four daughters, Sharon Renee Verloo, Rachel Talbot-Ross, Regina Philips, and Robin Talbot. Gerald's younger sister is Beth (Elizabeth) Talbot.

## **Collection Description**

The Talbot Collection is a collection of materials, many pertaining to the African American experience, gathered by Gerald E. Talbot in the course of his life. It is divided into five series containing like materials: Papers, Posters, Objects, Photographs, and Serials.

### **Series 1 Papers**

The Papers Series contains Talbot's personal and professional papers, including papers from his service in the Maine Legislature, as well as materials gathered by him. The books that were part of the donation, 475 titles, have been catalogued into the African American Collection's book collection. They may be found in the Libraries' online catalog by searching Talbot's name as author.

#### **Series 1.1. Politics**

This series contains materials related to Talbot's long career in federal and state politics.

#### **Subseries 1. Legislative**

This subseries--which contains twelve subseries--includes materials pertaining to the Maine House of Representatives, where Talbot served three terms from 1972 to 1978.

##### **a. General Information/Records**

This subseries contains government telephone directories, Talbot's legislative ID cards, a history of the Maine State House, and a list of joint standing committees and their membership.

##### **b. Roll Calls**

This subseries contains an extensive record of roll call votes on hundreds of pieces of legislation in the Maine Legislature stretching from 1973 to 1978.

##### **c. Legislative Documents and Acts**

This subseries contains several dozen bills and other legislative initiatives—as well as committee amendments--introduced during Talbot's tenure in the Maine Legislature.

##### **d. Legislative Records, Proofs, Journals, and Calendars**

This subseries contains legislative journals and calendars (which constitute the Legislature's daily schedule), proofs (which are transcripts of the statements and speeches made on the floor of the House or Senate), and records (which represent the legislative motions and roll call votes made during a given legislative session).

### **e. Memoria, Resolutions, Orders, and Proclamations**

This subseries contains various ceremonial legislative sentiments, including a proclamation recognizing the cultural contributions of Maine's black community and designating "Miss Black Teenage Maine Day" in 1973.

### **f. Speeches, Statements, and Newsletters**

This subseries contains speeches and statements made by Talbot, as well as then-Speaker of the Maine House of Representatives and others, on various political issues. Notably, it includes statements by Talbot announcing his intention to seek election (or re-election), criticizing then-Governor Longley regarding his rhetoric on minorities, and addressing the Maine Democratic Party convention.

### **g. Correspondence**

This subseries contains many of Talbot's hand-written notes. Of particular interest are the messages Talbot sent to colleagues in the Maine House of Representatives. These messages—often urging a colleague to support a particular bill or asking that an amendment be proposed--provide a glimpse into the real-life experiences of a legislator.

### **h. Campaigns and Elections**

This subseries contains material pertaining to Talbot's three political campaigns (including palm cards, campaign finance forms, and mailing lists), as well as broader, election-related documents such as candidate lists, election statutes, and work by the Election Laws Committee.

### **i. Committees**

This subseries contains material related to legislative committees on which Talbot served, particularly the Committee on Human Resources, of which Talbot was the chairman.

### **j. Publications**

This subseries contains publications related to Maine government, including a copy of the Maine State Planning Office's 1972 plan, a report on the legislative process, and several studies of the criminal justice system in Maine.

### **k. News Articles**

This subseries contains dozens of news clippings from the 1960s to the 1990s, many of which highlight Talbot's efforts to secure civil rights for black Mainers. Other recurring topics include the death penalty, drug abuse, and tax policy.

### **l. Miscellaneous**

This subseries contains material that does not fall into the above categories. Of particular interest, it includes a document indicating that between September 1973 and May 1977, about three-quarters of the University of Maine at Orono's faculty in the College of Business Administration resigned.

## **m. Oversize**

### **Subseries 2. Non-Legislative**

This subseries--which contains nine subseries--includes materials related to Talbot's political career that fall outside of his role as a legislator.

#### **a. Education**

This extensive subseries reflects Talbot's deep interest in learning and education. It includes studies of enrollment in Maine schools and community colleges, testimony given before the Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs, and reports on post-secondary and occupational training.

#### **b. Commissions and Task Forces**

This subseries contains material related to several commissions and task forces in which Talbot played a role, including the Maine Human Rights Commission, the United Way Substitute Care Task Force, and the Bias Crime Task Force.

#### **c. Associations and Conferences**

This subseries contains material related to associations and conferences Talbot was a member of or attended, including the Governor's Conference on Handicapped Persons, the Children's Defense Fund, and the National Governors Association.

#### **d. Campaigns and Elections**

This subseries contains material related to campaigns and elections other than Talbot's own political races. It contains pamphlets from Bill Hathaway's 1972 campaign for U.S. Senate, as well as buttons and other paraphernalia from Jesse Jackson's 1988 presidential campaign.

#### **e. Research Materials**

This subseries contains research materials that Talbot collected as a legislator, often in response to a constituent's inquiry. Topics include prisons, Native American land, welfare regulations, and the minimum wage.

#### **f. Speeches, Statements, and Newsletters**

This subseries contains newsletters from the Dunfey Family and from the Bureau of Public Affairs within the U.S. State Department.

#### **g. Correspondence**

This subseries contains a business card from Thomas Jenkins, then-Field Representative at the United States Commission on Civil Rights.

#### **h. Publications**

This subseries contains publications with no direct connection to Talbot's legislative service, including financial reports for the City of Portland, Maine, a primer on municipal budgeting, a report by the Judicial Council of Maine, and a booklet on the Selective Service System.

## **i. White House**

This subseries contains material related to Talbot's many interactions with the White House on issues pertaining to civil rights, economic opportunity, and education. It includes fact sheets on various policy initiatives, as well as a copy of President Carter's remarks at a White House event to honor members of the National Caucus on the Black Aged.

## **Series 1.2 African American History and Culture**

### **Subseries 1. Civil Rights**

This subseries gives a sense of the civil rights climate (at the local, national, and international levels) with information dated as early as 1835 (although the majority of information spans from the mid 1950's – 1990's).

This subseries begins with information from the United States Commission on Civil Rights (United States Commission on Civil Rights), including national publications, as well as information from the Maine advisory committee to the United States Commission on Civil Rights. The United States Commission on Civil Rights was created in 1957 by the "Civil Rights Act of 1957". The U.S. Commission on Civil Rights is a bipartisan, independent commission of the United States federal government that is charged with the responsibility for investigating, reporting on, and making recommendations concerning civil rights issues in the United States. These documents are dated from 1970-1995.

From here, a variety of information from civil rights cases, events, and groups; material on Martin Luther King, Jr.; as well as news clippings come together to paint a holistic picture of the civil rights landscape. Included in this series is a "must see" collection of news clippings, from the peak of the Civil Rights movement (1956-1966), which effectively bring this historical movement to life.

Of special interest, in the MLK subseries, is a signed letter to Gerald Talbot from Martin Luther King Jr. This subseries also includes addresses given at local memorial services for MLK, events in his honor, writings on his legacy, commemorative information, as well as contest submissions from children at the Harrison Middle School for a contest in honor of MLK's birthday ". This information is arranged chronologically, spanning from 1963-2008. Some materials are RESTRICTED.

### **Subseries 2. Education**

#### **a. BEACH**

In 1980, Gerald Talbot and his wife, Anita, founded BEACH (Black Education and Cultural History), Inc. BEACH served as an information and referral source, concerning black history and human rights. BEACH worked with community members and organizations to bring people together in support of peace and human rights for all. Among its many contributions, BEACH maintained a collection, and traveling display, of black history items (including busts of famous black people, documents, hand and leg shackles, books, etc.); sponsored events and

workshops to further racism awareness and equality; provided education scholarships; and sponsored, supported, and spoke out on legislation and issues concerning black people and other minorities (at the state and national level).

The items in the BEACH subseries include material to orient the reader to the BEACH Corporation, material regarding some of the work that BEACH was involved in (outreach projects and education within the schools and community), as well as materials that illustrate where our nation stood in the 1980's and 1990's regarding racism and racial equality.

Specific items in this subseries include:

- information on the "Tribute to Black Women of Maine" event, which BEACH established
- a 1970 article by BEACH entitled "Racism in America"
- notes from Gerald Talbot regarding a 1987 KKK visit to Maine
- information for groups BEACH was involved in, including the "Maine Coalition on Undoing Racism" & "REACH" (Respecting Ethnic and Cultural heritage)
- a collection of book jackets used in 1970's exhibits at the Portland Public Library, Portland City Hall, and various schools, to show what works existed about African Americans
- notes written by Gerald Talbot about Milton Roscoe Geary (the first black person to graduate from the old University of Maine Law School and major contributor to the equal rights movement)

Also included in this subseries (in the "Schools" folders) are letters to and from Gerald Talbot, in order to coordinate his speaking at local schools, records of some of the questions the children asked, as well as several "Thank You" letters written by the children. These materials not only show the content of what Gerald shared, and what children took away from his discussions, but also give insight to the climate regarding equality/racism/civil rights in the 1980's & 1990's.

Information in this folder spans from 1970-1995.

Some materials in this series are RESTRICTED.

## **b. Minority Specific Education**

The materials in this subseries include clippings, publications, and essays specifically related to minority issues in education. Scholarship resources and awards for minority students can also be found here. Included is an appeal for donations from The United Negro Fund; information on, and award letters for, the "PreCollege" program with the Portland School of Art; and information relating to the establishment of the Pedro Tovookan Scholarship for a Black student to attend the PreCollege Program. Also included is correspondence which shows a pattern of award recipients not being able to further their education, or utilize these scholarships, because they had to work in order to help their families financially.

Materials span from 1967 to-1995.

## **c. General Education**

This is a collection of publications and newspaper clippings that Gerald Talbot collected between 1979 and 1981 related to various educational issues (i.e.: truancy, teacher pay, community/adult ed.", school funding, curriculum, etc.).

Included in this series is: the 13<sup>th</sup> annual Gallup Poll; an edition of “The Maine Paper, a Conservative View”; and the December 1981 edition of the “Maine Insight” newspaper.

#### **d. Education Conferences/Training Resources**

Information on local education conferences/training resources that emphasized building equality in education and educational opportunities.

### **Subseries 3. NAACP**

In the Paper Series, The NAACP files are made up mostly of materials relating to the Portland Branch, from its inauguration in 1964 and spanning the next thirty years. From its inception, the Portland Branch was an influential proponent of civil rights. So much so that within three years of its founding, the Portland Branch was host to the entire New England Conference of Branches convention. The Portland Branch was involved directly with a number of legal cases, and specifically with the state of the prison system in Maine. They threw a number of events and annual Martin Luther King Day celebrations. Key synopses of the NAACP contribution in Portland can be found in the 20 year special edition publication materials and the interview Talbot engaged in with Charles L. Lumpkins of University of Maine, Orono.

The rest of the NAACP collection contains specific branch materials from Bangor, and a number of other branches around the country with whom Talbot had a connection. Rich historical information on the NAACP’s engagement with various civil rights issues can be found in the Maine Committee on Indian Affairs and the Maine Human Rights Commission files where Talbot was a member of both. This collection also includes materials from the National organization of the NAACP dating back to 1955. It provides researchers some of the cultural context through which the smaller branch organizations operated and also a connection to some of Talbot’s travels around the country for various national conventions.

### **Subseries 4. Materials Related to the Klu Klux Klan**

This subseries contains materials about KKK as well as produced by the KKK itself. The subseries contains materials regarding the KKK’s activities in Maine including events held in the state.

### **Subseries 5. Racism**

This subseries contains a collection of stereotypical racist memorabilia and research materials that Gerald Talbot collected, in part, for workshops/talks that he led in the community. Also included in this collection is correspondence, to and from Mr. Talbot, regarding workshops/talks on racism. These materials help us to define and better understand what racism is and how it impacts our society.

### **Subseries 6. Culture**

This subseries contains information on African American art and artists, history, and other parts of Africa American life that impacted daily living (from fashion and celebrities, to church, politics, and celebrations etc.). The various documents in this subseries lend themselves to our understanding of how African Americans have both impacted and been impacted by culture.



## **Subseries 7. Maine's Visible Black History Research**

This subseries shows the beginning stages and research that went into the book, *Maine's Visible Black History* (2006), which Gerald Talbot initiated and eventually co-authored and edited. *Maine's Visible Black History* explores how Black men and women have been integral parts of Maine culture and society since the beginning of the colonial era; it uncovers a rich and long-neglected strata of Maine state history.

This subseries is arranged as Gerald Talbot kept it, so as to preserve the original content and context; it opens with correspondence that began in 1979, when Gerald initiated reaching out to others for support in this endeavor. These letters not only show us how this project began, but also illustrate the immense lack of historical information that had been kept throughout Maine regarding the contributions and history of Black Mainers. This correspondence is followed by research materials and notes that Gerald gathered.

## **Subseries 8. Groups and Events**

This subseries contains files on various activist groups and events related to African American history. Materials are primarily from 1971-1995, and include groups such as the Maine Association for Black Progress, Maine Association of Black Professionals, and the Maine Project on South Africa.

For photographs connected to some of these groups/events see "Series 4. Photographs".

## **Series 1.3 Personal Papers**

### **Subseries 1 Gerald Talbot**

This subseries contains materials directly related to Gerald Talbot. Included here are personal correspondence, speeches, and interviews; as well as awards, employment, personal identification, and personal calendars etc. from the years 1964-1995.

Some materials in this series are RESTRICTED

### **Subseries 2 Family/Neighborhood**

- a. This subseries contains items regarding Gerald and Anita's four children Sharon Renee, Rachael, Regina, and Robin. Materials date from 1963-1991.
- b. This subseries contains items related to Talbot family history, dating primarily from 1865-1925. Dance cards from Tarragona club mention Sterling A. Dymond, William B. Stewart, William H. Stewart, Edward S. Buck, Edgar S. Buck, Charles A. Talbot (Gerald Talbot's great grandfather), Charles Raynsford Talbot (Gerald's grandfather), and Charles H. Smallwood.
- c. This subseries includes items related to the Glenwood Avenue Block Party from 1982-1993.

### **Subseries 3 Groups and Community Action**

This subseries contains files on Gerald Talbot's community engagement from the 1970s-1990s, through organizations and conferences: AARP, the Epilepsy Foundation of America, Greater Portland Epilepsy Association, the Pine Tree Epilepsy Association, the New England Circle, the Southern Maine Area Agency on Aging and Maine Senior Games, Veterans for Peace, Vision 2020, Center for

Vision and Policy, Eastern Seaboard Apprenticeship, Healthy Families Maine, 1980 Maine Perspective, Maine Summit on Justice and the Economy Invitation, General Meeting on Youth, Ingraham Volunteers, Maine Leadership Council, Maine Medical Center, Maine Environmental Research, Sweetser Male Mentors, Portland YWCA, We the People NE.

## **Subseries 4 Collecting Materials**

This subseries contains various materials related to Gerald Talbot's collecting, including catalogues, collectibles resources, purchase receipts, and notes to and from suppliers. The materials are in chronological order to preserve the order Gerald maintained his records. Materials date from 1961 to the mid 1990s.

### **Series 1.4 Subject Files**

This series includes information on various subjects Gerald Talbot maintained files on: Community, Grants, Museums/Archivists, "Older Americans", Portland Jetport, SALT II, Schools/Colleges, Sexual Harassment, and Three East Video Productions. Materials date from the mid-1950s-1990s.

### **Series 1.5 Ephemera**

This series includes material for which the context is not clear, without a direct link to other items in the collection.

## **Series 2 Posters**

The Posters Series consists of posters and other graphic formats documenting African American history and culture. The material has been organized into five topical groups: University of Southern Maine (USM), Made by Talbot, Events/Information, Politics, People/Groups. In deciding where to place a poster, the order of the groups is the order of preference, thus the fact that the poster had to do with USM would take precedence over Made by Talbot, which takes precedence over Events/Information, and so on. Within the groups, material has been arranged in chronological order, oldest to newest, with undated material at the end. The posters take up 21 map case drawers.

## **Series 3 Objects**

The Objects Series contains artifacts pertaining to Africa, African America, and America in general. The artifacts range from wooden, cast iron, ceramic, and beaded items, to a framed original KKK charter and paper reproductions. Many items in this series were given to Talbot by family and friends.

## **Series 4 Photographs**

The Photographs Series covers a wide range of subjects, from family studio portraits of the 1800s and more informal snapshots from the 1960s and 1970s, to civil rights marches and Miss Black Teenage Maine Pageant contestants. Many of the photographs came from the *Portland Press Herald*. There are 512 photographs, 11 glass plate negatives, and copy negatives in 9 boxes and two map case drawers.

## **Series 5 Serials**

The Serials Series consists of incomplete runs of 7 magazine titles primarily of interest to African Americans. The titles include *Ebony* (1956-1995), *Jet* (1968-1993), *Essence* (1992-1995), *The Crisis*

(1974-1995), Black Enterprise (1978-1995), Emerge (1990-1991), and Black ethnic collectibles (1987-1989). The Collection does not include all issues within the date ranges.

### **Series 6 Publications**

This series includes a large collection of published materials that Gerald Talbot collected. The subject matter of these materials fits into several categories throughout this collection, and therefore have been filed separately as "Publications". In this series you will find a variety of material, in both form and context. The earliest materials date from 1920 and 1940, and most materials are from the 1960s-mid-1990s.

### Series 5 Serials

This Series consists of incomplete runs of 7 serial titles. The Collection does not include all issues within the date ranges.

**Ebony** magazine is a major publication that caters to African American middle-class consumers in a format similar to *Life* magazine, its contemporary.

**Jet** magazine was founded in 1951 as a “Weekly Negro News Magazine.” It is still published, in a format with more than news.

**Essence** magazine focuses on issues important to African-American women, featuring stories on health, career development, fashion, parenting, and social issues, along with lifestyle articles written by and for Black women.

**The Crisis** magazine, founded/edited in 1910 by W.E.B. DuBois as a crusading voice for civil rights, paved the way for later magazines such as *Ebony* and *Jet*. An official publication of the NAACP, *The Crisis* magazine continues to examine critical issues confronting African Americans, the broader American society, and the world.

**Black Enterprise** magazine focuses on business and economic topics for and about African Americans, providing news and commentary on money management, personal finance, business management, professional and managerial issues, and updates on industry trends. According to business critics Karen M. Rowley and David D. Kurpius, *Black Enterprise's* focus on the Black business community provides an alternative view of society to that given by the two mainstream business publications, *Forbes* and *Fortune*, which focus almost entirely on covering the White-dominated corporate world.

**Emerge Magazine** lasted from October 1989 to June 2000. During that time, *Emerge* distinguished itself as the premier African American news-magazine and garnered more than 40 national journalism awards.

**Black ethnic collectibles** magazine provides information regarding Black Memorabilia, Black art, and other collectible items which depict the roles of African Americans in American history.
