Top 3 things not to dump down your drains

RIGHT BELOW
YOUR FEET:

Locally, stormwater and sewage are carried in a single pipe. After heavy rain or snowmelt, the combination can be swept into the Bay from a combined sewer overflow (CSO).

A combined sewer overflow discharges here into Casco Bay.

- 1 Cleaning wipes
- 2 Fats and grease
- 3 Toxic chemicals such as bleach, paint thinner, pesticides, and prescription drugs
