My dear Mamma -

I am writing
this in school. I have no more
recitations this morning.

Cora was here yesterday. She
came Thursday night and
stayed until noon yesterday.

I am afraid she did not have
a very good time, and I guess
she was about started when she
left. She did not think much
of our fare.

I stayed alone last night
for the first time since I have
been here. Grace is going
home this noon and Charles
to night so I shall be alone

until Monday night any way.

I got a letter from Lydia yesterday saying that she could come on neither of the Sundays that I invited her. I am awfully sorry but think I shall get her come the last Sunday before Memorial.

There is nothing going on that we can go to so I am getting rather tired of the place. There was a drama given by the senior class of the High School last night but of course we could not go. Next Monday Mr. Bickford the stable keeper says he will take a large load of girls to Sebago Lake if they will go. He says they

can be there all of the afternoon. Possibly I may go. Miss Fickett said she wanted us to go with her some time so if she goes I think I shall.

Mr. Corthell is away to day to be gone until Tuesday so perhaps Miss White will let the girls go to the entertainment if it is repeated to night.

It seems good to have Eva here and we enjoyed it very much. She expected to find Eunice here but she went on the train before Eva came.

Last night Charles and I went down to call on Mrs. McKenney. We had some nice
