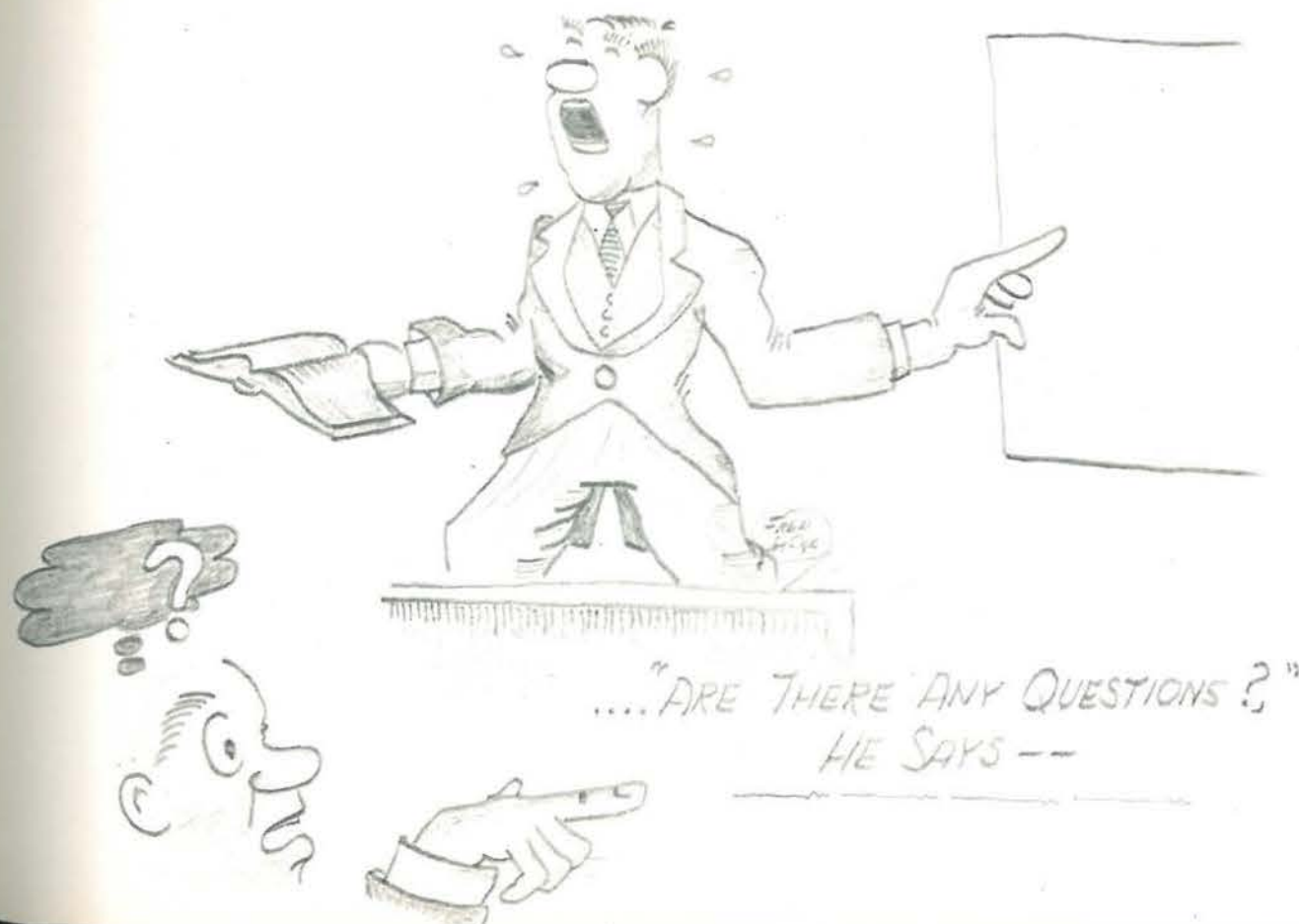
Dedication

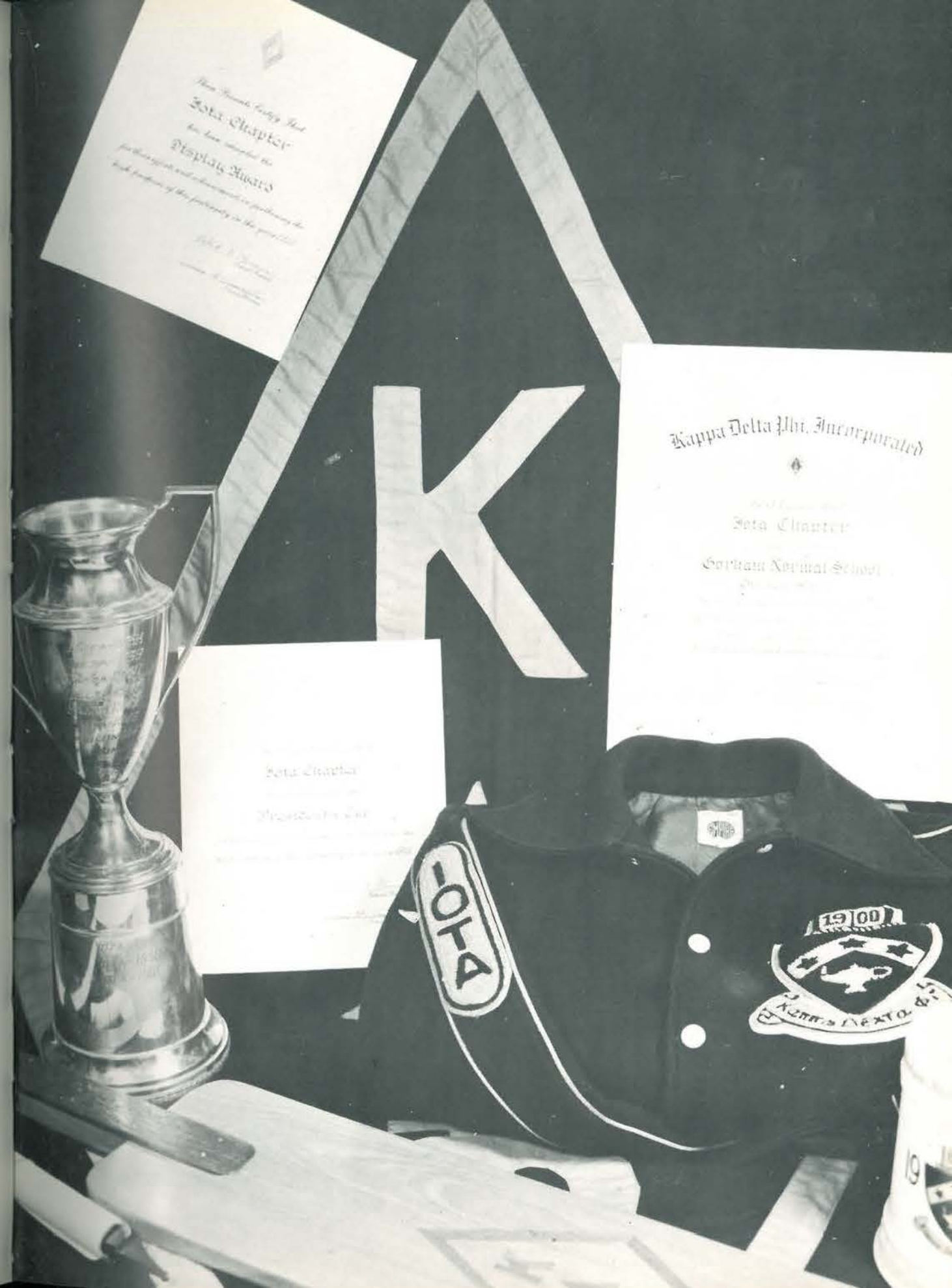
It has been the purpose of the men of this organization to be a useful force in the student body by providing entertainment, participating in school activities, keeping

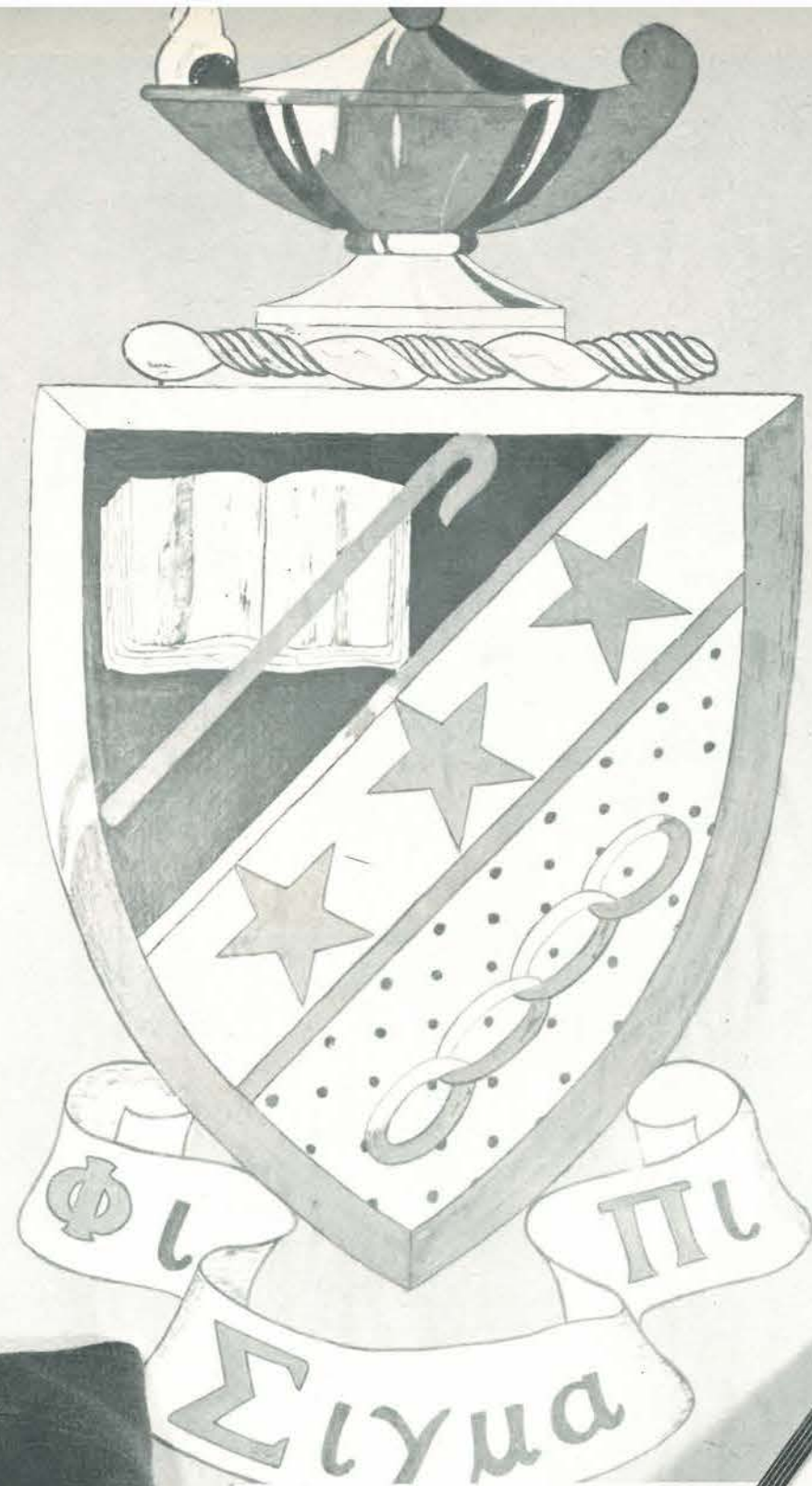

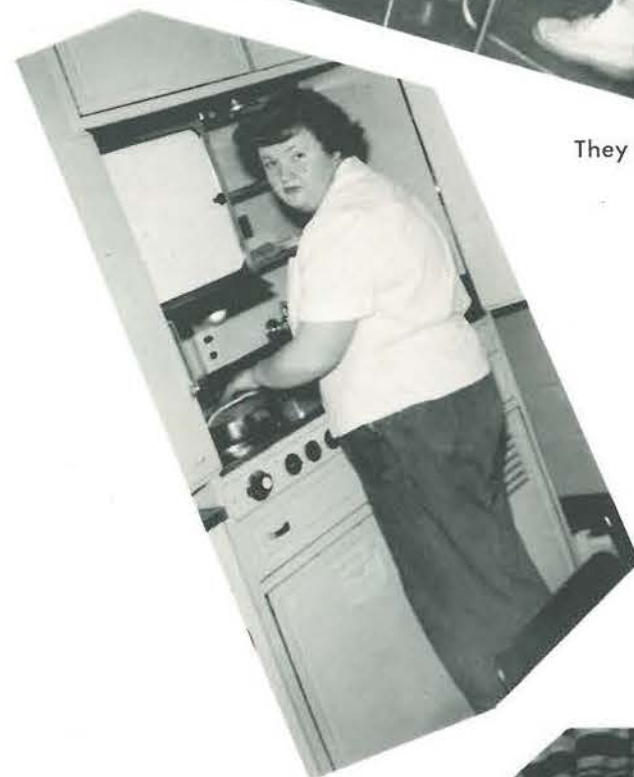
