The instructors, as well as the student body, look forward, with great anticipation to the new gymnasium.

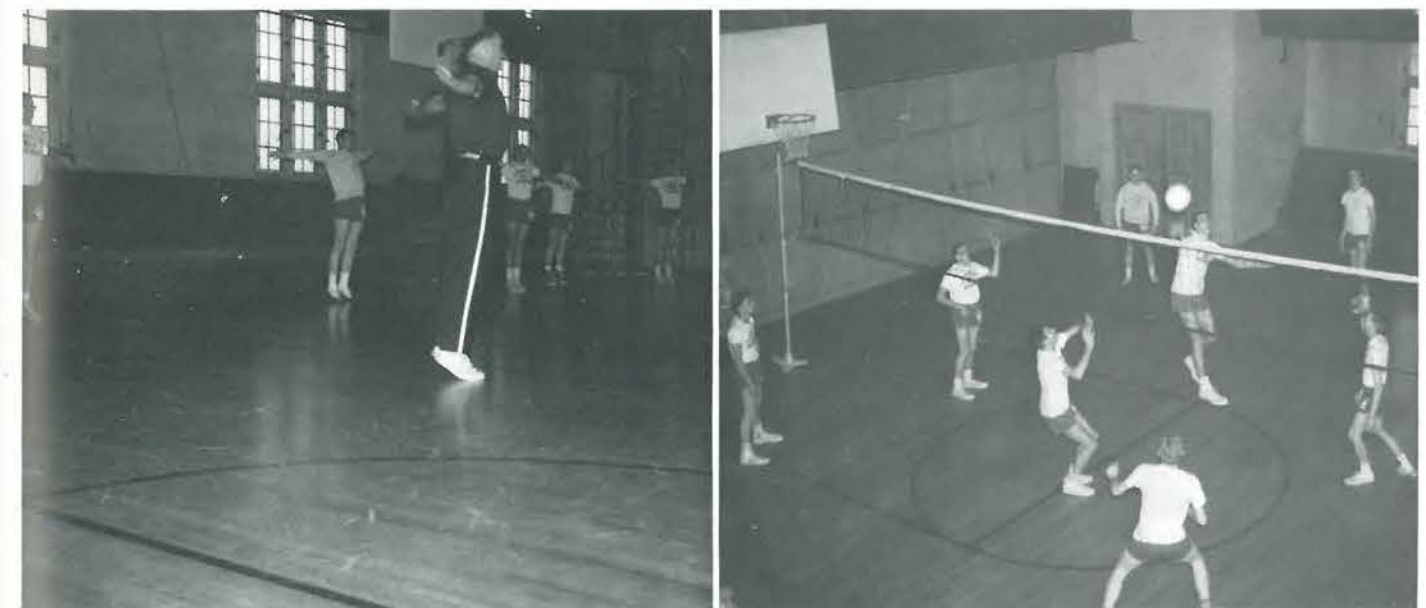

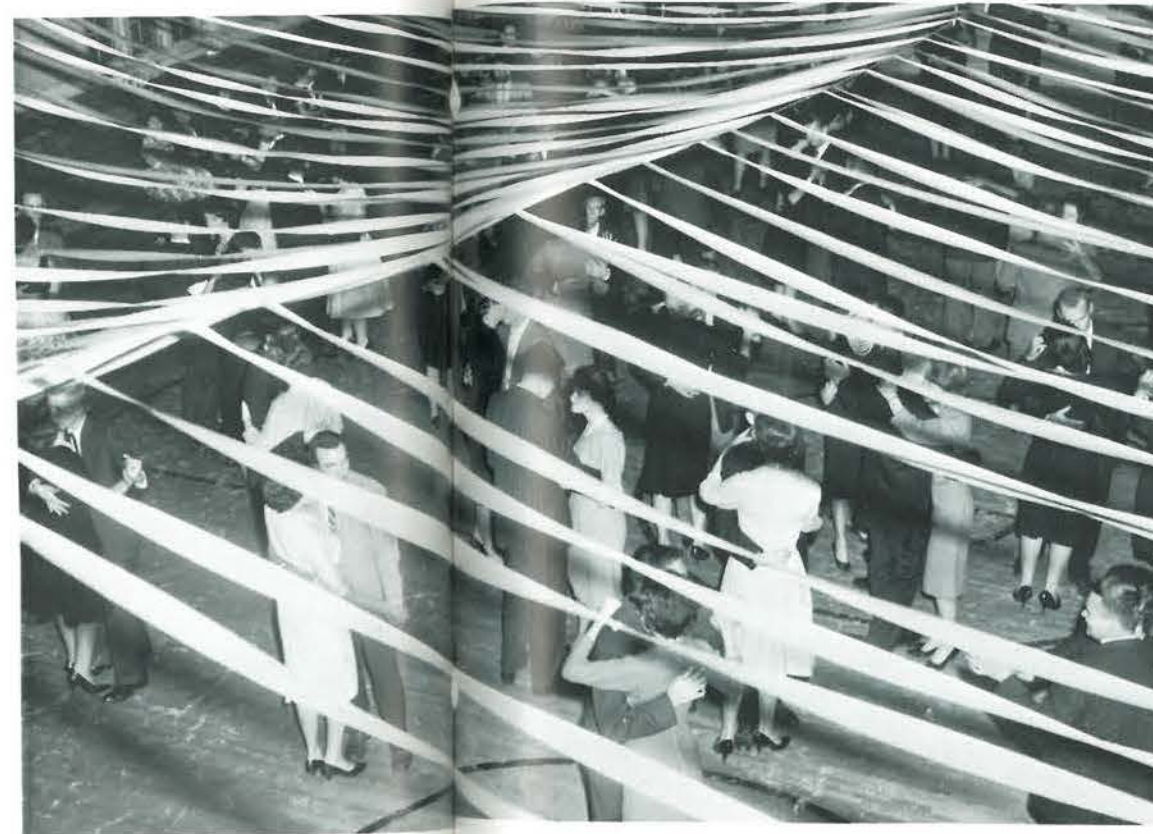
