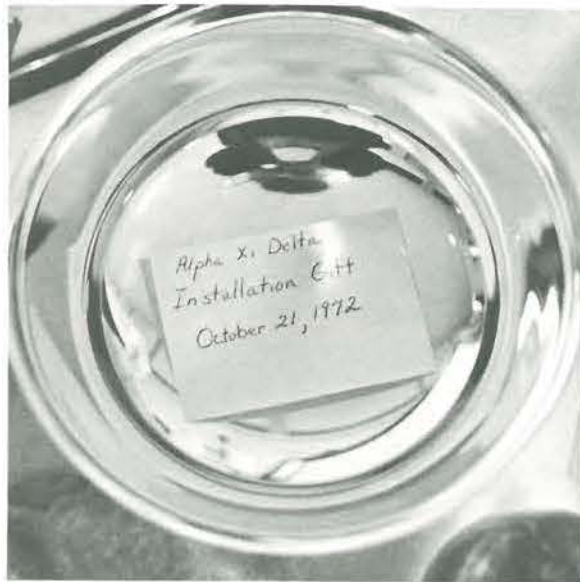
# DELTA ZETA

# KAPPA DELTA EPSILON

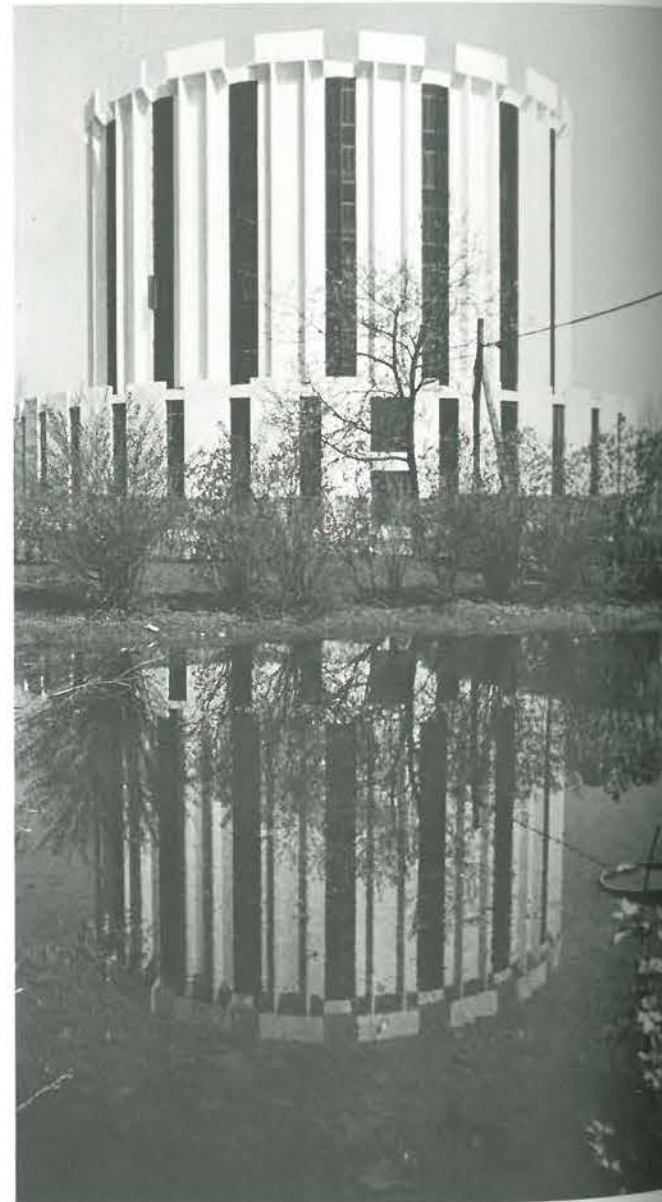

Past activities include Easter visits to a local nursing home, making collections for Muscular Dystrophy, adoption of an overseas orphan, and work with exceptional children in various areas.



LAW





The University of Maine first established a law school in 1898 at Bangor, Maine. A charter member of the Association of American Law Schools, the old College of Law was probably one of the better law schools of its time in the United States.

Enrollment at the old law school fell off sharply during the first World War, and in 1920 the trustees decided to close it. The decision was received with dismay by the legal profession in Maine and by those in the academic world who understood the intellectual contribution that a strong law school can make to the government and cultural life of the state.

In 1961, the University of Maine established its law school, at 168 High Street in Portland, the former Children's Orthopedic Hospital of Portland, built in 1910.

Within the short period of four and one-half years the school became fully accredited. It gained provisional approval from the House of Delegates of the American Bar Association in February, 1964, and full approval in February, 1966; and in December, 1966, was admitted to membership in the Association of American Law Schools. Its degree is acceptable everywhere in the United States for purposes of bar admission or graduate law study.

In September 1967, the voters of Maine approved a Referendum question authorizing the issuance of \$1,800,000 of State of Maine bonds for the planning, construction, furnishing and equipping of a Center for Research and Advanced Study at the Portland campus of the University of Maine. Subsequently, they approved \$920,000 for the construction of a new building for the University's Law School; and, when it was found that these funds were inadequate for the Law School's purposes, it was decided to combine the Law School funds with those of the Center for Research and Advanced Study and to build one building in which to house both functions. This fall, The University of Maine School of Law began operation in its new home in the Tower on Deering Avenue, UMPG's newest building.



## NOON FORUM

The purpose of the Noon Forum is "to present other aspects of the law and to expose law students to various sides of the legal profession." The leader of the program this year was Laura McMullin, a first-year law student who had this to say about the mechanics of the Noon Forum: "It's an informal thing with the speaker talking for about twenty minutes and then opening it up for questions. The Forums lasted about an hour and were held at noon every Wednesday."

They did not begin this year on a weekly basis until January 31. Among the speakers this year were **Henry Berry**, Cumberland County Attorney; **Dr. Peter Goldfine**, Director of Psychiatric Training and Research at Maine Medical Center; and **Probate Judge Nathaniel Haskell**.



# MOOT COURT

A mere point spelled the difference between victory and defeat for the National Moot Court Team. In the competitions held last fall, the team defeated Cornell and Albany in the first two rounds. In the meeting with Boston College, however, they lost by a single point. To compound the loss, Boston College went on to the regional championship. Despite this, they gained a trophy for having the best brief.

The faculty adviser to the Moot Court program, **Stephen Feldman**, discussed the numerous aspects of the program. "The Moot Court is a fairly traditional part of the Law School curriculum where students argue a case before a panel of judges in a trial court setting. The case is usually one waiting to be heard by the Supreme Court. The student, after he has made his oral presentation, is questioned about different points of law in his case by a panel of judges. Under rules finalized this year, this exercise is compulsory for first year students and optional for second year students. The members of the teams are chosen from the ranks of the second year students. Third year students are not eligible for these competitions."

There were two National Moot Court Teams last year. The one that battled Boston College to a near

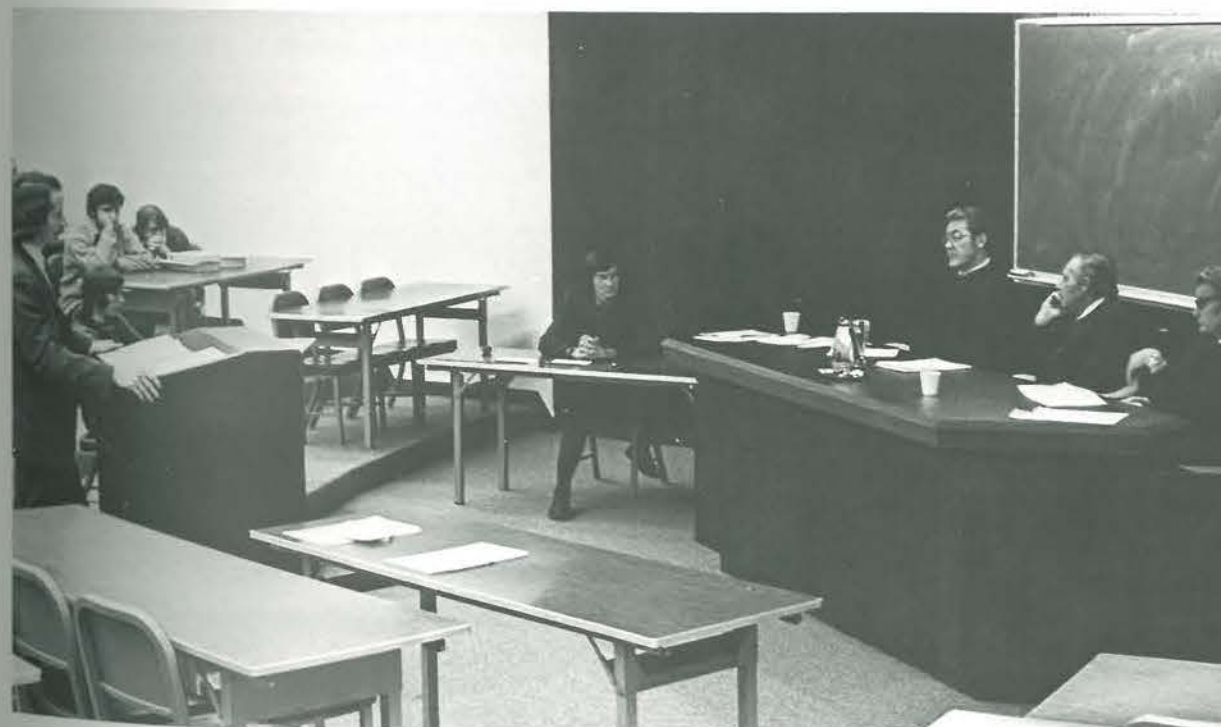
standstill was made up of **David DiMuzio**, **Martha Whitten** and **Richard Smith**. Because of a veto from one school, the other was not allowed to compete. This one was composed of **Robert Avaunt**, **John McElwee** and **Mark Sheskey**. In a private match with Cornell's second team, they lost an eyelash decision and a case of wine put up for the occasion too.

**Clarke Hambley** gained a berth on next year's National Team by winning in both the Brief and Oralist categories. **George Bowden** secured a place on the International Team winning the Brief competition and tying for best Oralist with **Dana Cleaves**. Feldman has added to the National Team: **Elizabeth Boynton**, **Gary Norton**, **Philip Merrill**, **Peter Fessenden**, **Martha Whitten**, and **Ronald Battacchi**; **Stephen Bragdon** and **Joseph Huston** were the additions on the International Team.

Feldman is enthused about next year's competition. "We definitely have room to do better. We were lucky last year to have gotten such a good team by the haphazard process we had. But the luck of this year will be replaced by the science of next year."

## Maine Law Review

The examination of different law problems is the theme of the **Maine Law Review**. The semi-annual publication is composed of a Major Attack and a Comments and Notes section.

The Major Attack is a lengthy piece written by a prestigious member of the law community. **Senator Edmund S. Muskie** and **Peter Avery Anderson** were the authors of the Major Attacks this year. Anderson, a Director of the Pine Tree Legal Association, talked about the need for a Public Defender System. Senator Muskie expounded on the possibilities of a National Environmental Policy.

Student works dealing with a particular law problem form the Comments and Notes section. Because of the volume of these articles, the Board of Editors has to pick and choose. According to **Gary Thorne**, one of the editors, "We are very selective in choosing these; they have to be of publishable quality."

Thorne gives some of his thoughts about the **Law Review**. "It has been a student operation ever since the Law School started. We made enough copies for every student and every lawyer in the state. We even receive requests for reprints of some of the articles. To me, working on the **Law Review** is a real honor." It is also an honor for the Law School to have the **Maine Law Review**.

## Edward S. Godfrey Dean, 1961-1973

"I've been fortunate in having a loyal faculty and staff and a sensible and industrious group of students. The time has come though for new leadership and new ideas. It will be good for the school to have a new Dean."

At the end of August after eleven years as Dean of the University of Maine Law School, Edward S. Godfrey will move on to other endeavors. He has been the Law School's only Dean since it re-opened in 1961.

But for chance, he might never have become a teacher, let alone a Dean. "I always had a yen to teach. I started tutoring in college and had taught high school." Godfrey, though, left the teaching field and was in private practice when he caught the eye of the Albany Law School at Union University. "I wrote a brief for the Court of Appeals which brought me to the attention of the Dean there. I told him I enjoyed teaching, and one thing led to another. I ended up teaching there for fourteen years.

"In 1961, the University of Maine merged with Portland University and was looking for a Dean for its law school. Someone mentioned my name to Dr. Austin Peck, the Vice-President for Academic Affairs, and I became a candidate. I was interviewed and was named Dean."

There were many severe problems facing the Law School back then. The location in the former Children's Orthopedic Hospital was one, another was the low enrollment. The operating funds for Portland University had come only from tuition.

"Things were pretty grim. The building itself, though solidly build, was not a very inviting place at that time. But the funding as well as the enrollment increased over the years. After several attempts at getting a new law school building were defeated, a bond issue was finally approved, and we were able to combine the law school with the new research center to effect economics in construction."

Enrollment in law schools have recently enjoyed a boom; but its effects have posed some problems. "Nationwide about 290,000 law students graduate each year. However, only about 14,000 jobs open up for them. It's a tightening market and something has to give. The wave of applicants has subsided somewhat. If such a large number of lawyers continue to graduate each year, the question will arise, can our society absorb them and use them!"

When his tenure as Dean expires, Dean Godfrey will explore a number of options. He will leave on a European vacation in September, part of which will be spent in England studying English property and municipal laws. When he returns he will spend some time in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and Albany, New York working on an attack on property taxation. "I started it in 1959 but never completed it."

Dean Edward Godfrey guided the Law School through a most difficult time and was able to reap the fruits of his labors. But "I'm tired of being Dean," he says, and so he will try other things for a while. His loyalties, though, lie with the Law School, for next year he will return as a teacher.
